
This location is connected by the subway from the VMC to York University, University of Toronto, MaRS Discovery District, University Health Network and Toronto Metropolitian University.

Vaughan is in the heart of York Region, which has the highest concentration of technology talent in the Toronto-Waterloo corridor.

Seventy-three per cent of Vaughan's population over 25 years old has a post-secondary certificate, diploma or degree – surpassing both the provincial (68 per cent) and national (67 per cent) average.

The Information and Communications Technology sector in Vaughan employs more than **6,400 workers** across more than **1,200 companies**.

- 54 professional scientific and technical services employing more than 1,450 workers.
- six computer and electronic product manufacturing businesses employing more than 330 workers.
- more than 160 manufacturing businesses employing over 4,600 workers.
- 130 construction businesses employing more than 2,600 workers.

- direct access to highways 400, 407 and 427 and is minutes away from highways 401, 404 and 410.
- connections to rail service via the Canadian National MacMillan Yard, the Canadian Pacific Kansas City Vaughan Intermodal Terminal and the passenger rail service via the Maple and Rutherford stations on GO Transit's Barrie line.
- subway service via three stations on the Toronto Transit Commission's Line 1.
- access to non-stop flights on 75 carriers to 180 destinations worldwide via Toronto Pearson International Airport – Canada's busiest airport – located within 10 kilometres of Vaughan's southwestern boundary.
